#### REQUIREMENTS FOR THE SUBMISSION OF ABSTRACTS:

File name: Author(s)' last name

Language of abstract: Ukrainian or English

Length: 2 to 5 full pages

Page settings: A4 format, portrait orientation

Margins: top – 20 mm, bottom – 20 mm, left – 20 mm, right – 20 mm

Font: Times New Roman Cyr 14, Line spacing: 1.5, Paragraph spacing: 1.25 cm

At the beginning of the abstract, include the UDC code in left-aligned, 12 pt Times New Roman Cyrillic font.

On a new line: TITLE – in capital letters, centred, in 14 pt bold Times New Roman Cyrillic font.

Next, provide the following information about the author: the student's first and last name, the name of the educational institution, the city and country; the supervisor's first and last name, academic degree, academic title and position, and the name of the institution, the city and the country.

Young researchers with an academic degree may submit abstracts without a supervisor.

Formulas, figures and tables are numbered in the order of their appearance and referenced in the text:

- Formulas must be formatted in Microsoft Word using the 'Equation' insertion feature.
- Figures should be created in Microsoft Word using the 'Illustrations' insertion functions (Shapes, Charts, SmartArt) and grouped as a single object. They should be centred and not have text wrapping.
- Tables should be created using the 'Tables' insertion function in Microsoft Word.

The amount of tabular data and illustrations must be appropriate.

The list of references must be presented in accordance with the requirements of DSTU 8302:2015 and be written in Times New Roman font size 12. References to sources in the text are indicated in square brackets using the source number in the list followed by the page number [1, p. 25].

Abstracts that do not comply with these requirements will not be considered.

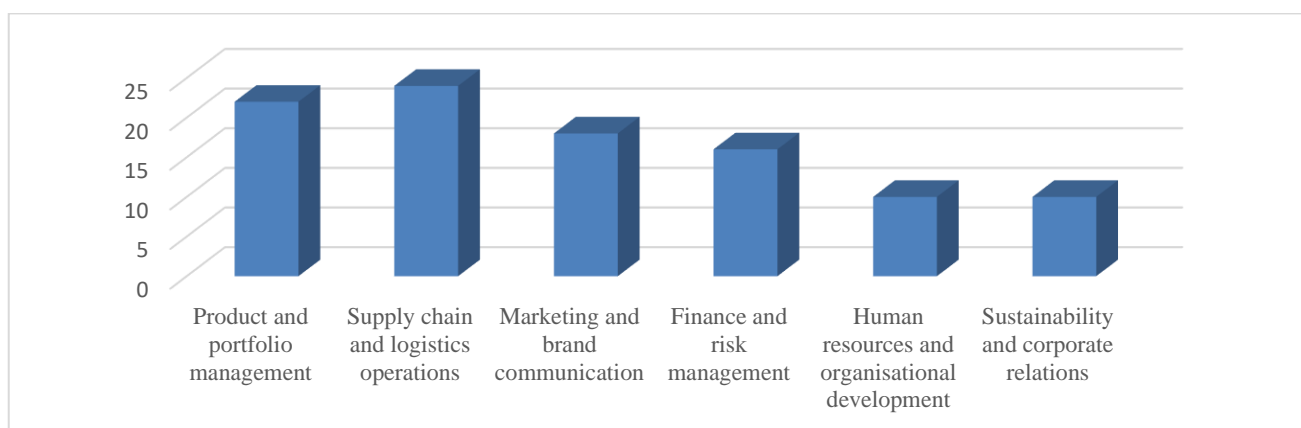


Fig. 1. Estimated sensitivity of Coca-Cola’s key activity domains to external environment factors, %
