Course description

The course aims to develop advanced international professional communication skills in English in the context of IT and the global digital environment. Students develop the ability to communicate confidently and effectively with colleagues, clients, managers and international partners by participating in professional discussions, negotiations, problem-solving activities, presentations and project-based tasks.

Course objectives

- Develop advanced professional communication skills in English in the IT field.
- Develop the ability to discuss complex professional issues, express and justify opinions, and present solutions.
- Expand vocabulary related to digital transformation, emerging technologies, leadership, negotiation, global business and the future of work.
- Study B2-level grammar structures in a professional and IT-related context.
- Develop skills of critical thinking, argumentation, negotiation and professional decision-making in English.

Expected learning outcomes

Students will be able to:

- Discuss current trends in IT, digital transformation and emerging technologies.
- Express, explain and justify their opinions in professional discussions.
- Participate confidently in international meetings, negotiations and problem-solving activities.
- Communicate effectively with international colleagues, clients and business partners in challenging professional situations.
- Analyse professional problems and propose appropriate solutions in English.
- Deliver structured and persuasive presentations and respond effectively to questions.
- Create and present a professional digital project or solution to a real-world problem.
